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Christmas songs in EduArt

Advent is a time full of anticipation and joy at EduArt. We enrich this time for children with Christmas songs, which have many benefits for children.

Development of speech and musical sensitivity
Singing Christmas songs and reciting poems contribute
to the development of speech and musical perception.
Children learn rhythm, melody, intonation and pronunciation.
Verses and melodies help them improve their memory
and develop their vocabulary.

Support for social and emotional development
Singing songs together and reciting poems strengthen
the sense of belonging in the classroom. Children experience
joy from the collective experience, which supports their
cooperation and empathy. Advent songs are often full
of kind and calm emotions, which have a very positive effect
on children.

Connection with traditions

Christmas songs and poems are carriers of traditions and cultural heritage. Through them, children become familiar with Christmas customs and traditions, which contributes to the understanding of cultural values.

Creating a Christmas atmosphere

Christmas songs help children tune in to the magic of Advent. Lyrics full of symbols such as snow, Bethlehem, angels or a Christmas tree bring joy to children and support their imagination.

How we include songs in the kindergarten program Singing carols is often part of morning circle or physical activity. Nonetheless they accompany us all day and also inspire our artistic activities. Children sing Christmas songs to their parents as part of pre-Christmas community events. In kindergarten, they often accompany their singing with simple rhythmic instruments such as a triangle, tambourine or jingles.

Shadowing in a kindergarten in Cyprus

In November, the first trip abroad took place within the Erasmus+ program. It was attended by teacher Nada from the Hlubětín kindergarten, who, as part of a week-long shadowing at a kindergarten in Paphos, Cyprus, observed methods of direct work with children and obtained information about the Cypriot education system. During her stay in the host kindergarten, Nada also introduced the philosophy of EduArt kindergartens and was given the opportunity to engage in direct work with children. Thanks to this, our Edík, a popular puppet and an integral part of EduArt kindergartens, also got his space. The knowledge and experience gained will also be passed on to the entire EduArt team and we believe that it will enrich our kindergartens.

Dramatic education at EduArt

Puppets Edík and Julinka

Edík was created directly from the name of our kindergarten, EduArt, and thanks to this, he became the mascot of all three of our branches. He is associated not only with our name, but also with the basic values of the kindergarten, which he brings to children and parents with his friendly demeanor and playful nature. Edík, together with Julinka, form an inseparable pair that guides the children through the daily program and helps them with adaptation, communication and various guided activities.



Julinka, who communicates with children in English, is the key to the natural acquisition of a foreign language. Julinka motivates children not to be afraid to discover English in a pleasant and playful environment. Julinka's presence brings elements of interaction in English into the daily life of the kindergarten, which allows children to absorb new words and simple phrases in a completely non-violent way. Children have the opportunity to hear English in the context of fun activities, and with the help of the Julinka puppet, learning a foreign language becomes a natural part of their day.

Together, Edík and Julinka form an inseparable pair that can perfectly capture children's attention. Each of them represents a different language and a different form of communication, thus teaching children that even if someone speaks a different language, it is always possible to find a way to understand each other. This playful interaction with the puppets not only facilitates the adaptation process for children and supports their language development, but also contributes to creating a friendly atmosphere in the kindergarten, which we strive for in all our branches.



Edík, who speaks Czech to the children, is their familiar and friendly guide. He helps them in particular when they get to know the new environment of the kindergarten and in creating a sense of security, which is especially important for newly arrived children. Edík supports children in various situations when they need to find courage or want to share their feelings and experiences. Teachers often use Edík in communication circles, where children learn to communicate openly and share their thoughts. Edík helps children overcome any initial uncertainty and supports them to feel good in the kindergarten.
